**I never thought I'd see the day! By Dr David Jeremiah (JER)** – many people are blind to the destructive cultural trends of the day or are too quick to minimize the negative impact these trends are having on society. Dr Jeremiah identifies the nine major indicators of this looming disaster and then issues a strategy for turning the tide and equipping us with the weapons we need for the battle ahead.

**Has God spoken? By Hank Hanegraaff (GRA)** –the author uses manuscript evidence, archeology, predictive prophecy and more to memorably demonstrate that the Bible is divine rather than merely human in origin.

**Serenade to the Big Bird by Bert Stiles (STI)** – a new edition of the classic B-17 tribute: after completing 35 missions in B-17s, Bert transfers to a fighter squadron and then killed in Hanover, Germany. The book portrays the tragedy of war and loss of a talented writer.
